St. Carlo and Divine Mercy in confession

Since today is Divine Mercy Sunday, I asked myself, what does St. Carlo say about God's mercy? It seems to me that St. Carlo experienced and taught that God's mercy is best revealed in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Thus, his mother writes, "Carlo said that Christ is manifested in confession and that we reconcile with the Father through the Holy Spirit. The fruit of the Sacrament of Penance is peace. Carlo felt the need to explain that confession is also called the sacrament of mercy, because it reflects God's love for us – the love of he who died on the cross to save us and redeem us" (<https://bit.ly/mysoncarlo>, 121). I read here that confession is the expression of God's mercy for us. It is the Sacrament of forgiving love. The Trinity wants to forgive us. Christ's ambassadors, the Saints, such as St. Carlo, invite us to welcome His mercy. Are we allowing God's mercy to touch, love to transform, and peace to flood our hearts?

Help Not Harm: Take Action to Support Bill C-218



You're invited to visit: helpnotharmcanada.ca where you can e-mail your Member of Parliament (MP), asking for their support of Bill C-218 (The Right to Recover Act), which would amend the Criminal Code to prevent Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) from being provided when mental illness is the sole underlying condition. Without this change, MAiD will be available for those suffering from mental illness alone beginning in March 2027.

Extraordinary Graces of Divine Mercy

"In three places in her Diary, St. Faustina records our Lord's promises of specific, extraordinary graces: -I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession [beforehand] and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (#1109). -Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life [Eucharist] on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment [read purgatory] (#300). -The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment (#699)."

That is, one may be without need to go to Purgatory, or go straight to Heaven if one dies soon after confessing well and receiving Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday.
