### St. Carlo's 'wake-up call'

When Carlo found out that he had type M3 leukemia, he had “a big smile and said, ‘God has given me a wake-up call’” (<https://bit.ly/mysoncarlo>, 17). His mother writes, “He did not allow anxiety or anguish to conquer him. He reacted by trusting in God. And in his trust, he decided to smile” (p. 18). What gave strength to St. Carlo to smile in the face of tragic news, that he would basically die soon? Could it be that he believed and trusted in God who raises even the dead to life? Carlo would not have that faith if he didn't draw it like fresh water from the springs of life in the Church. Do you, and if so, where do you nourish your faith? If you continually draw close to and seek unity with Christ in His Church as Carlo did, you can also face any difficulty in life, even with joy and hope.

In 1976, Archbishop Philip Pocock made a courageous moment-of-conscience decision, choosing to stand firmly for life, dignity, and Gospel values. That decision gave birth to ShareLife and to a mission that has been carried forward, year after year, through the dedication of parish communities like ours.

### Plenary Indulgence After the Jubilee

The Jubilee year is over, and with it a unique ability to obtain an indulgence. How can we attain an indulgence now, after the Jubilee year has ended? You may receive a partial indulgence in many ways. To obtain a plenary indulgence associated with a church or oratory, when devoutly visiting them, recite one Our Father and the Creed. It is required: Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and Prayer for the intention of the Pope.

Next, all attachment to sin, even venial sin, should be absent. These works are highly recommended: 1) adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for at least one half an hour; 2) devout reading of the Sacred Scriptures for at least one half an hour; 3) the pious exercise of the Way of the Cross; 4) the recitation of the Marian Rosary in a church or public oratory or in a family group, a religious Community or pious Association
