For disarmament and peace

Let us pray that nations move toward effective disarmament, particularly nuclear disarmament, and that world leaders choose the path of dialogue and diplomacy instead of violence.

Pontifical Collection - Good Friday, April 3

On Good Friday, a collection will be taken up at the Holy See's request. It is for the support of the many social, educational, and parish projects of the Church throughout the Holy Land, and it helps to assure the Church's presence and a measure of security and peace for our brothers and sisters.

The Cross of Christ

It is through the crucifixion that Christ defeats Satan and triumphantly attains our salvation, allowing us to enter our heavenly home. As we approach the Holy Triduum, let us take some time each week to reflect on the passion of Christ. We can do this in many ways, such as praying the Stations of the Cross or the sorrowful mysteries of the Rosary, reading the passion narratives in the Bible, or simply gazing upon a crucifix.

About Fasting and Abstinence on Good Friday

Fasting is the limitation of food and drink, typically to one main meal and two smaller meals, with no solid foods in between. (But remember to drink enough fluids!). We fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. We fast because it helps us to pray better. An empty stomach can lead to more attentive prayer. Catholics aged 18-59 are bound to fast. Those with impaired health should not fast in any way.

Abstinence is avoiding certain kinds of food or drink, typically meat or other desirable foods. Catholics are obliged to abstain from meat every Friday throughout the year (except solemn feast days). Instead of abstaining, you may substitute special acts of charity or piety on Fridays. We abstain on Fridays because it's the day of Christ's saving death on the Cross; we abstain to share in His work of saving the world. Catholics aged 14 and older are obliged to abstain.

Without this change, MAiD will be available for those suffering from mental illness alone beginning in March 2027.

Living in Passion with Jesus like St. Carlo

It's Palm Sunday. The Holy Week has begun. It is the week of the Passion-suffering and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We walk with Him as we participate in the celebrations of the divine liturgies. St. Carlo Acutis also experienced his own passion and death, even intentionally seeking then and there to be closely united to Jesus. St. Carlo's mother says that he "built [this relationship with Jesus] with years lived under the light of God, under his continuously requested protection, under his continuously desired light" (<https://bit.ly/mysoncarlo>, 23). Do we build our relationship with Jesus, and if so, how? Do we unite our suffering and even future death to His? Do we daily live under the light of God, of His truth and merciful love? Do we also continuously ask for, and seek 'protection of God'? Do we know what we need the protection from? Do we continuously desire God's light in our lives? At times, people think that God doesn't like our desires, even our abilities to wish and desire. Truth is, God wants us to desire what is good for us. Do you desire what God wants to give you? Do you know what God wants to give you? God wants to give you Himself. He is your loving and good Father. Ask Him, and He will give.
