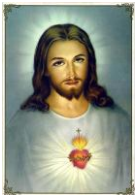


Pope Leo XIV New Encyclical *Magnifica Humanitas*

Corpus Christi and St. Carlo

St. Carlo's mother, Antonia, writes, “To understand Carlo's spirituality, you have to delve into the Eucharistic mystery. When he took his first Communion at the age of seven, he began to go to Mass and perform Eucharistic adoration before Mass or afterward every day” (<https://bit.ly/mysoncarlo>, 210). So, the Eucharistic Jesus was the center of his spirituality.

He wrote about the Corpus Christi, *the Body of Christ* in the Eucharist: “in ‘hiding himself’ in the Eucharist, he gives us all of himself, his Body, his Blood, his Soul, and his Divinity, and he helps us realize our sanctification” (*ibid.*, 211). The hidden Jesus is given in the Eucharist. Christ gives himself to us to make us holy.

St. Carlo continues, “If people understood the importance of the Eucharist, there would be such long lines to go take Communion that you would not be able to enter the churches” (*ibid.*). The presence of those who faithfully come to the Eucharist bears witness to their faith in the Most Holy Sacrament, while the absence of many at Masses testifies, unfortunately, to their lack of faith. St. Carlo showed faith that drew him closer to the object, rather, the subject of his heart's desire, Jesus Christ.

The “superior of the convent, Mother Maria Emanuela [...] said that it was] the Tuesday after the feast of Corpus Christi when Carlo received his First Holy Communion [...] He was calm and composed during holy Mass, but he started to show signs of something like impatience as the moment for receiving holy Communion approached. With Jesus in his heart, after holding his head in his hands for a short while with a prayerful attitude, he started to move as though he could not sit still. It seemed like something had happened inside him, something of which only he was aware, something so big that he was not able to contain it. ... The nuns closest to the altar could not keep themselves from watching him, deeply moved, even through the thin blinds on the grate, and realizing that it was as if Carlo was fulfilling a long-awaited desire” (*ibid.*, 212-213). How much Carlo loved Eucharistic Jesus! Do we love Jesus present in the Eucharist? Are you impatient to receive Him? Do we desire to love Him?
